Are you new to seed saving? Are you worried about cross pollination? Does the thought of hand pollinating and building isolation cages fill you with dread? Don't despair! The SEED beginners seed saving guide will show you how to save more than 20 different kinds of seeds in your first year without any extra work!! Just follow these rules and you can be sure that you will produce only pure varieties!!

In the vegetable garden, some plants rely on insects for pollination. Others are self fertile but can also be crossed by insects. Some rely on the wind. Some will not cross at all. There seems to be so much to remember and it can be very confusing at first. Only grow what is on this list and you will be guaranteed a successful seed harvest from everything!

THE FOLLOWING WILL NOT CROSS GROW AS MANY VARIETIES AS YOU LIKE OF:

- peas
- climbing French beans
- dwarf French beans
- tomatoes (except beefsteak)

GROW ONLY ONE VARIETY OF THE FOLLOWING:

- cucumber
- melon
- watermelon
- aubergine
- okra
- basil
- coriander
- parsley
- sweetcorn
- spinach
- carrot
- parsnip
- radish
- rocket
- leeks
- onion
- beefsteak tomato
- pumpkin maxima
- pumpkin mixta
- pumpkin moschata

WITH THESE YOU HAVE TO MAKE A CHOICE EITHER OR AND GROW ONE VARIETY OF EACH

- beetroot or chard
- pepper or chilli
- courgette or pumpkin of the *pepo* group
- celery or celeriac
